Hunting investigations/incidents – any offence involving the illegal activity of coursing, hunting, poaching, and lamping

21/12/22 – Outwell, Wisbech – Reports of hare coursing involving a silver Ford Galaxy no further details.

23/12/22 – Terrington St Clement – White transit van number plate ending **58 XOY involved in coursing no further details

24/12/22 – Marham – Silver 4X4 involved in hare coursing no further details.

Rural investigations/incidents – any offence involving the damage or loss to agriculture, its practices and the rural working environment, alongside rural community.

24/12 – Aldborough (Fakenham) – Large haystack fire suspect arson

24/12 – Ryston (Downham) – Damage to a van and multiple plumbing equipment stolen from within.

25/12/2022 – Methwold – Wheelie bin set on fire suspected arson

Wildlife/Animal investigations/incidents – any offences which contravenes current legislation governing the protection of wild animals, plants and domesticated animals

Heritage investigations/incidents – any offences involving damage or loss to the historic environment

10/12 – Kings Lynn – Graffiti has been sprayed on church doors suspected in protest of bell ringing!

22/12 – Wighenall St Germans – Theft of Lead from church roof.
